
Dear Parents and Carers,

Through our membership of the cluster we are fortunate to have access to and contacts with counsellors, therapists, Speech and Language services, the Otley Children's Centre and a great Parent Support Adviser and assistant. As part of the recent addition to

the cluster offer for parents and children is Cygnet training. The training is designed to support parents with children who are neurodiverse.

Our Learning Mentor Miss Milner has been trained in this programme and has been running



the parent workshops alongside the cluster PSA over this term at The Whartons. They have been hugely successful, giving advice, strategies and opportunities to share ideas.

Whole School First Aid Training

This half term we were delighted to welcome trainers from Paco First Aid who spent the day in school with the children.

It is incredibly important for children to learn key life skills at school as well as academic knowledge. Having external trainers in school to support the children with acquiring specialised skills is incredibly powerful. We have been so fortunate that this year the Sarah Jackson Community Wish have financially supported all the schools in Otley by organizing whole school child centered First Aid training.

Each class had a training session in the hall with the instructors where they learned interventions which may save lives: from how to ring the emergency services to CPR resuscitation techniques using CPR dummies. The children were so enthused and motivated by the training that many parents were enlisted as 'willing volunteers' at home to practice bandaging and recovery position techniques. Thank you so much to the foundation for their incredible support.
